EVANGELISM — THE LIFE-BLOOD OF THE CHURCH

Perhaps there is not a greater need in the church of our Lord today than the need for a greater emphasis upon evangelism. This need can best be realized when we understand that evangelism is in a very real sense the "life-blood" of the church, i.e., **it is the activity which causes the church to thrive and grow.** In the absence of evangelism there can be no church growth.

Evangelism is the work of converting souls to Christ. Jesus taught that it would be through the work of evangelism that His word would be spread. He said to His apostles, "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature," (Mark 16:15) and "Go ye therefore and teach all nations..." (Matthew 28:19). The fruits of evangelism are recorded in the book of Acts: "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized...and believers were the more added to the Lord...the number of the disciples was multiplied...the number of the disciples multiplied in Jerusalem greatly..." (Acts 2:41; 5:14; 6:1,7).

Unfortunately, many seem to have the idea that evangelism is that work done by the preacher in the pulpit when the church is assembled. However, when we look to the pattern for church growth in the book of Acts, we find that evangelism was not limited to the worship assembly. The church met primarily for worship and edification and then scattered to do its evangelizing. They "**went everywhere preaching the word**" (Acts 8:4). They assembled for worship, instruction, and fellowship and then went out to teach and win souls to Christ. That pattern is evident throughout the book of Acts.

Those responsible for evangelizing are Christians. It is not the "preacher's work," or the "elder's work;" but rather, it is the work of each Christian. Each Christian should ask, "What am I doing to evangelize?" "Am I looking for and using opportunities to lead a soul to Christ?" If you believe that you are limited by a lack of ability, consider the following methods of evangelism: enrolling friends and relatives in a Bible Correspondence Course; talking to someone about Christ and His church; showing interest in another by sending them an article on a biblical topic such as baptism, salvation, etc.; inviting your neighbor, relative, friend, postman, pharmacist, etc. to worship with you; - **(Continued on page 3)**
